President's Message

Hello all,

It looks like spring is almost here. The bees are flying and the pussy willows are blooming... all good signs for beekeepers. I hope your electric fences are all up because the bears are also out and about, and they are hungry! My bees at home are eating a lot of pollen. My survival rate was around 50%; the ones that died, I have concluded, were due to mites.

On a brighter note Shreve, your head of the apiary committee, informed me that all the hives at the club apiary are alive and taking pollen. That's very good news.

Package bees will be coming soon. I know it was a cold and rainy February and March in the south so most of the bees are delayed a week or two.

At last month's meeting we talked about printing flyers for the club. Marilyn and Bill have come back with some estimates. We will make the final decision at our next meeting, on what best suits our club price, in regard to quality and going with a local company as opposed to a franchise. I'm hoping Laurie will be able to attach the different quotes received to the newsletter.

March Meeting notes

The meeting was held March 13th, 2021 via Zoom.

Minutes were accepted from the January meeting.

Treasurer's Report

Robin Gray reported there is \$9,443 in the KBA checking account. Paid membership is at 84. We made \$1643 from bee school. We paid \$200 to NH Beekeepers for insurance. There were no other expenses so far this year.

Shreve Soule motioned to accept the report, Mike Brown seconded. Treasurer's report was accepted.

Apiary Report

Shreve Soule, the apiary committee chairman, reported that he put winter patties on the hives at the apiary with the exception of the top bar hive. All hives were alive and well. He stated that we may be able to do some splits this year, and we may get honey.

Shreve also asked if we wanted to install a new package at the apiary. The club would like a package from Bam this spring.

Shed Committee

We would like to build the storage shed at the apiary in late July or early August.

Shreve Soule is getting pricing together. John Chadwick is working on a materials list. Dana Ramspott will be approaching different lumber companies to ask them for donations.

Bam knows a person who owns a sawmill who said he'd mill all of the framing wood for free.

Marilyn Milne's husband works at Durgin and Crowell, and the business will be donating shiplap.

KBA Club Brochure

We would like to have the club brochure updated so that we will have something to give the businesses that we will ask for shed material donations. It would show who we are and what we do. Kim Pease made a brochure that had been used previously. Marilyn Milne is updating that brochure. The shed committee has decided that the updated brochure is what they would like to use. The club needs to vote on printing them.

Mike Brown asked what it would cost for printing them and how often they would need to be reprinted.

John Chadwick stated that the club had taken the brochures to the Farm and Forest Expo. John thinks Barbara Burns had about 200-250 of them printed at Staples previously. Robin Gray said he thought they were \$1.00 each and were a higher quality brochure.

Betsey McNaugten suggested we allow a cost of up to \$150 to have the brochures printed. She said that 80# to 100# paper is good.

Marilyn Milne will check prices at Staples in Concord. Bill Beardslee suggested that we look into some local printers, like The Kearsarge Shopper, and he would be willing to do that. It was stated that we get a discount from the Kearsarge Shopper due to being a non-profit organization. Capitol Copy in Concord, New London Copy Specialists in Newport, and Kinkos in Concord were also suggested.

Shreve Soule made a motion to set aside \$150 for purchasing club brochures. Mike Brown seconded the motion. A vote was taken and all were in favor.

The shed committee will make the final determination as to where the brochure will be printed.

Irradiation

Bam is taking several pallets of hives to be irradiated on April 1st. He will be picking them up on April 8th. The cost is \$20 per box. The equipment needs to be put in contractor trash bags.

There was a question about what kind of radiation was used. It is Gamma radiation, and there is nothing residual.

Shreve asked if the apiary should have their extra boxes irradiated. He will check these hives and send them in if needed.

KBA Directory

Laurie Hardt would like to put a KBA member directory together for those members who are interested. The purpose of the directory would be to find other members who live near you to collaborate with. The directory would include your name, phone number, email address and the name of the town you live in. It would not include your street address.

It was agreed that Laurie could set up a directory for members who decide to "opt in." This directory would be shared with ONLY the members who opt in. It would not be published on the website.
