PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings to my fellow beekeepers,

The time change has made me a happier person since we have more daylight hours after work now! I've seen 2 good cleansing flights from my hives. Using a small stick I like to clean out dead bees from the hive entrance this time of year. They would do it on their own, but it makes me feel useful.

Of my 8 hives, most felt like they still have good stores in them after hefting them. One got some sugar cakes. This is the time of year where things can go south fast, especially if the spring is wet and cold into May. Now that the bees have had a cleansing flight or 2, it would be fine to throw on some pollen substitute. My personal preference is to wait until the cleansing flights begin in March with temps in the 40's. If your hives did not survive winter this year, chin up, we all have lost hives. Do not feel embarrassed, try to learn from your mistakes. An inspection diary or log is a good way to help with this. Weeks pass by and it is difficult to remember small details from the past year. I try to write a small note on each hive. Some members are smartphone savvy and dictate their notes into the phone. I note the date/time, weather conditions and what's blooming. What did you see? 1 frame with eggs/larva? Frames with pollen and nectar or honey? When did you do a mite check? How many? There are many fine details that you won't remember. Heck, I now forget what I walked out to get in the garage! Document and you won't be sorry.

There are so many things to think about with beekeeping. Plan ahead, try not to be a reactive beekeeper. It will save you some stress. The bees will always give you a surprise or two during the season!

For those of you that just over wintered your first hive/hives, what are your plans? Are you going to try and increase the number of hives in your yards? If so, do you have the extra hives to do so? Do you plan to test and treat mites?

KBA T-SHIRT and LOGO UPDATE

Our new logo designs were voted on at the Harvest dinner 2023, and we are moving forward with the ordering.

Diane paid \$50 for the embroidered logo set up.

There is no charge for a screen print logo and if we choose to have screen print, only the \$50 will be applied to our order. We can have the KBA Logo on the front and the KBA smoker on the back, which is what I propose we agree on doing, since it's the same price..

There is a minimum order of 24 T Shirts for any screen print idea. Any design we wish, such as the smoker on the front, can be done, but we need to get our account established.



The base price for the basic shirts is only \$12.00 each, Plus sizes a little more. There are many styles of shirts to pick from.

For embroidered, there is a minimum order of 12 T-shirts. Size and colors are needed, and this will be treated as a separate order.

It is easier to have 1 color for the screen print- The shirts must be all light colors or all dark to contrast with the logos, but can be a mix of sizes and colors. Let's make a final decision.



I have the order proposals and color samples.

The smoker logo will be adjusted to make it transferable and is screen print only at this price. I told them one color, probably black for a light color shirt, or silver for a black shirt.front and back the same color.
