We have some very dedicated individuals and you made my job easy and fun. Happy Holidays, New Years, and Winter solstice!

Well I don't know about you, I enjoyed the Harvest dinner and speaker, Andrew Munkres, very much. Thanks to John and Betsy Chadwick for hosting Andrew for us. Andrew reminds me a little of my father in law. Let's say they share a creative trait that most of us just don't use enough. Having an inventor's mind can come in very handy and sometimes save you a lot of money. Andrew spoke on winterizing hives and presented some of his preliminary results which goes against what most of us have been taught over the years. Look up Condensing Hives on the web. He touched briefly on an experiment on treating mites with heat. The man built his own heater devices for this research when he figured the commercial item was too expensive. I can't wait to hear the results from that in a couple years. Back to Condensing hives, I did this last winter and had 90% survival and didn't need to feed in the spring. I winter with 2 deeps. I'm hoping for the same results this winter. This is not a new concept, it's been around for years. Check out this video when you can. It's got an easy to follow presenter.

My hives are ready for winter. Just put my rigid foam around the outside of my hives. I'm up to 13 hives now and trying to figure out what I will need for next year.

I might build a few more deeps in the garage this winter. I'm going to use the DeMaree method again next year for swarm control and honey production.



Don't wait till spring to make your plans! Remember Bees should be ordered by March. One other project I'm going to make this winter is a Oxalic Acid vaporizer. Cheaper than a provap 110 unit. \$35 versus \$300-500. Torch not included. I'll let you know how it works.
