Mouse guards are on, insulation is under the cover, and the hives are heavy. As much as I enjoy the warm weather it is time for it to go. Time for the bees to cluster and make the long trip to Spring. Now it's time to think about next year's goals and start preparing. For the 1st or second year beekeepers it will be a very, very long wait to see if you bees make it till Spring. What are your goals for next year? KBA and the rest of the bee club's in NH will be receiving grant money from NHBA via a USDA block grant of around \$40,000 next year around March. We need to put on our thinking caps and come up with some ideas for research and education for the money. This will be discussed at upcoming meetings. If you have an idea for a project, please come to a meeting and share your ideas. For instance, I think the industry needs to really study probiotics and pollen substitutes more. Beekeepers spend hundreds of dollars every year without any real scientific evidence that they provide a benefit to the bees. Perhaps some sort of project with mite control?

Maybe you always wondered if your bees would swarm if you stacked 6 honey supers in April without a queen excluder? Last year I did away with all my upper hive entrances and added 4 inches of insulation under the cover along with 1-2 inches around the outside of the hive. Yes my hives survived with little mold found. Was I lucky? Let's put our antennae together and figure out a fun project.

OCTOBER 2024 KBA MEETING NOTES

October 12, 2024—At Sutton Fire Department. Warner was having their annual festival so we could not use the town hall.

Secretary's Report Diane Mancino. Newsletter Was sent out to all KBA 355 contacts which includes about 103 annual and 10 lifetime members. We use gmail for our email and only 1 newsletter was mailed to a member by USPS. I delete any contact that requests unsubscribing from the emails. It has been brought up that contacts should be deleted from the rolls after 3 years of non renewal. Let's include a membership renewal notice in the monthly newsletter. I plan on going through the Gmail contact list and purging the expired nonmembers.

I received emails from members donating equipment and requesting assistance with their beehives. No new members were added this month.

I'd like assistance adding others access to Gmail and being able to send out emails in case I am not available or offline.

Treasurer's Report Robin Gray was absent, Prior membership reported at 103 paid members, KBA Account balance \$5773 which included honey sales from Musterfield farms. Porta Potty was paid at \$55 every 2 months

Committee reports

KBA Apiary Report Amelia Lantz October 7, 2024 There are 14 colonies of honeybees in the Apiary—1 SRVRTC, 2 Dana, 11 KBA. Of the KBA colonies, there are 2 Nucs, 3 in TBH, 1 eight frame, 5 ten frame— two single deep, two single+medium, one in two deeps. All of these colonies are being fed 2:1 syrup, all replenished Oct 7th, and one 5 gallon pail of 2:1 syrup remains in the shed. KBA bought 100 lbs of sugar off Troy Hall. It takes two 5 gallon pails of syrup to feed all the colonies. Dana has recharged the drill batteries. Dana is also cutting 1/2" hardware cloth into mouse guards.

All of the colonies were queenright as of 28 September. They were treated with Formic Pro mid-September. With continued feeding, hopefully they will be at winter weight by the end of October.

We will treat with OAV and wrap the hives mid-November. An inventory of what we have for winter wrap, and a plan for how we will winterize, should be done asap.

Bam has a new knee that is healing, Amelia is gone until mid-Nov, so the syrup-making, feed-refilling, winter wrap inventory work will be shared by John C, Dana R, Ali C, and Mike P of the apiary committee, and anyone else who'd like to help!! A big Thank You to Laurie Bride and her husband for signing up, and then, stirring up syrup & feeding the Apiary colonies in September. Their huge contribution of time & trouble to support the bees set a path for good health for the fall, and we are grateful!

Next HOWS November 16 Hive Wrap and feed for winter (subject to change).

Bee School Bob Deluca Newport wanted a "Facility Request form" that listed the dates and Shreve got the proof of liability insurance coverage. A Committee meeting was held October 9, they discussed the form and it was submitted to the school on Thursday October 10. We want to start Bee School on January 25 and go for 5 Saturdays. Waiting for approval. 9-12 am We have the presenters and it is coming together. We have a coffee maker and supplies for bee school. Member Valerie Carter sent an email volunteering for Bee School Bee School Raffle: Betsy made a motion, was seconded, and approved that we will purchase and raffle off a full beehive setup at bee school. Mike Plunkett will sell it at cost for \$200.00

Speaker Committee Kim Pease & Susan Menard absent, no report.

Library Committee Patrice Fredette no new news. No requests for books. Patrice keeps the books at her house. Discussion was made should we sell the books?
