Now is the time to be vigilant: keep an eye out for swarm cells, monitor space in the brood nest, and consider adding supers if your colonies are strong. Swarm season is just beginning here in the Granite State, so timely management can mean the difference between a booming honey crop and a hive hanging from your neighbor's apple tree! KBA's HOWs are a great resource for beginning beekeepers and veterans alike. There is a list of upcoming HOWs on the KBA website.

Secretary's Report Diane Mancino

The KBA March newsletter was sent out along with the meeting minutes.

A membership renewal letter was sent out and 4 members were added to the 2025 paid list.

Reminder: https://kbanh.org/join/ is also the link to renew your membership. My weekly task is updating member status when members pay the renewal fee or sign up and add to our database. As of April 27, I have 93 listed in the 2025 paid list-7 more than the treasurer's report.

Current KBA member profiles are being labeled as Mentors if they elect to do so. An effort is being made to match new beekeepers with members in their community. We will be able to check the KBA member contact list and pull up a list of "just mentors" to cut down on unnecessary emails. 3 mentors were matched this month. Please contact us if you are needing help, or would like to be a mentor in your area.

The HOWS schedule was sent out to members, along with event reminders. A good video was created and uploaded on DEAD OUTS AND BEEHIVE FRAME CONDITIONS. It can be viewed on our KBA Facebook Page

I hosted a ZOOM social hour KBA Member Zoom Social Thursday March 20, 7-8:30 pm Invitations went out to all paid KBA members. It was fun. Contact me if you would like to have more of these and can you help host one.

The monthly meetings have been recorded through voice memos since 2023, I uploaded them and stored them in KBA Google documents. It is noted that as of right now only the Secretary and Webmaster have access to these files unless requested. The GOOGLE backup phone number needs to be updated and assigned to a member. Treasurer's Report Robin Gray The KBA Bank Balance \$7,405, member status 83 members. 22 lifetime members. We are still working on matching online Stripe payments to our database. Email payments received to KBANH.ORG should also be sent to the Treasurer to verify they have been updated.

We verified that we had approved a \$200 donation to the Beekeeper relief fund 10/2024 but still needed to pay it.

A motion was made to accept the Treasurer's report and seconded.

Committee reports

Apiary Report Shreve Soule We have a sign up sheet for anyone who would like to conduct a HOWS or assist at the HOWS event. There are still some slots that have not been filled. Hive status: 2 live over winter NUCs we will be installing 3 new packages from BAM, who is getting them from Georgia & populate the top bar hive around April 15.

Amelia talked to Dave and Dorina Priebe, NH State Apiary Inspector. They will be speaking at the club apiary in June. Amelia has been laid up with back problems, and has not been able to work the apiary. Let's step up, pitch in and help maintain this great club asset!

Apiary expenses: Shreve bought cases of honey jars at Better-bee and Formic Acid strips. \$480 for bee packages.

HOWS we had a good turn out April 5 for the HOWS on dead outs and electric fences, about 20 people came out on a very cold morning. The following HOWS were canceled due to weather. A good video was posted on YouTube of the event.
